- Odd numbered addresses water on odd numbered days.
- Must water before 10:00 a.m. and after 6:00 p.m.
- These rules are in effect from May 1 through September 30 of each year.

Planting Trees

The time is at hand to work in yards and gardens, and is the ideal time to look for trees to plant. First, look for healthy foliage when you pick out a tree at a nursery. Dieback on the branch tips or damaged trunks are signs that the tree is already stressed. When looking at bargain trees, look extra close for signs of stress before purchasing. Unless you have to, do not plant in the heat of the summer. Spring or fall are the best seasons to plant. Large Balled and Burlapped (B&B) trees may look impressive, but often will take much longer to get established due to their size. Container grown trees in pots will do well as long as you cut the encircling roots before planting.

Shop at local nurseries; they can give you the best advice on what to choose that will do best in your landscape. Please contact your neighborhood arborist with any questions. The City of Hailey's arborist on staff, Stephanie Cook, can be reached at 788-9830 x 31.

Hailey Water Department has published the Annual Consumer Water Quality Report, which shows the results from 2016 water testing of metals and water contaminates. The tests are done in late summer and reviewed by the EPA. Hailey's tests are all within the proper ranges, with NO VIOLATIONS.
