Information About Your New Bill

This month's utility bill is your first bill on the new metered water rate (except for some commercial accounts, which have been charged a metered rate for sometime now). This new metered water rate bill includes the following line item charges:



- ◆ Water base monthly charge* (\$7.95) plus metered water charge.
- ◆ Sewer base monthly charge* (23.60).
- ◆ Water bond charge (\$3.94).
- ◆ Sewer bond charge (\$5.64).
- ◆ Rubbish charges.
- ◆ Any miscellaneous charges (such as dumpster charges, penalties, administrative charges, etc.), as applicable.

** These rates are for a standard 3/4" water service. If you have a larger water service both your water and sewer base monthly charges will be proportionally higher.*

The metered water rates, on a cost per thousand gallons, are as follows:

▪ 1,000 gallons to 50,000 gallons	\$0.48
▪ 50,000 to 100,000 gallons	\$0.97
▪ 100,000 to 150,000 gallons	\$1.38
▪ 150,000 to 200,000 gallons	\$1.73
▪ 200,000 and above gallons	\$2.07

Street Department News

Snow Removal Regulations

Adherence to city regulations is critical to an effective snow removal effort for all Hailey citizens. A friendly reminder of those rules:

- Do not plow snow across any public street, alley or other city right-of-way.
- Do not plow snow onto any public street, public parking area, alley or sidewalk.
- Do not place snow within 25' of a fire hydrant on the street side of the hydrant.
- Do not place snow in such a way as to obstruct any traffic regulatory sign.
- Snow shoveled from a roof into any street, alley or sidewalk shall be removed at the owner's expense.
- Any snow piled that requires city removal in order to maintain public streets, alleys, or other ways, shall be removed at the owner's expense.
- During winter maintenance operations, vehicles, personal items, etc., must not be left in the right of way. The City of Hailey is not responsible for such items.

- Veterans Day is the American name for the international day of remembrance known as Armistice Day.
- Veterans Day is always observed on November 11, the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War One.

- Veterans Day was first commemorated in America by President Woodrow Wilson in 1919. Congress made it a legal holiday nationwide in 1938.
